














STANDARD FOR SPECIMEN LABELLING

Our specimen acceptance policy, in accordance with our laboratory accreditation requirements, is that all specimens received for Testing must be labelled with two unique identifiers: surname and given name (mandatory), date of birth and/or NHI number.

A confidential request using a code as identification is also acceptable.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Full name • No other identifier

The only exceptions will be where the specimen cannot be recollected e.g. histology, cervical smears and liquid based cytology.
